



## Community Impact Council (CIC) Volunteer Position Description

### The Role:

The Community Impact Council (CIC) is a permanent United Way of Central Alberta (UWCA) committee that reports directly to the CEO. The committee is made up of not more than 15 members, including the chairs of the three Priority Impact Teams (PIT). The committee represents the community impact work of UWCA. The predominant task of the committee is to receive reports from the 3 PIT crews on agency applications and decide where UWCA donor dollars should be invested in accordance with the Community Impact Framework.

### The Commitment:

Community Impact Council members have a minimum of 10 meetings per year, with some additional hours in March & April. We ask members to sit on the committee for a minimum of two years.

### Desirable Skills:

- Understanding of broad social issues and trends in Central Alberta
- Knowledge of social services sector in Central Alberta
- Policy development skills
- Strategic visioning and planning skills
- Understanding of community collaborations and partnerships
- Understanding of research and evaluation
- Understanding of community asset and capacity building principles
- Knowledge of funding landscape in Central Alberta
- Understanding of governance principles
- Corporate/business perspective on Central Alberta's social issues and trends
- Health sector perspective on Central Alberta's social issues and trends
- Education sector perspective on Central Alberta's social issues and trends
- Social service sector perspective on Central Alberta's social issues and trends

### Desirable Experience:

- Previous Citizenship Review Committee experience or equivalent experience in the social sector
- Volunteer non-profit experience (Board and non-Board)
- Current or previous employee of a non-profit
- Working for and involvement with a municipality
- Experience in a rural setting would also be desirable

Committee members must declare the nature and extent of any potential conflicts of interest (perceived or otherwise) at the beginning of each assignment and meeting. The member will be excused from discussion and voting and must leave the meeting room during discussion and voting.
